"Overcoming The Spirit Of Fear"

2 Timothy 1:7, Psalms 23:4 (NKJV)

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2 Timothy 1:7 NKJV

7 For God did not give us **the spirit of fear**, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.

Psalms 4:4 NKJV

4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear not evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

- In the year 2004, I was lead by the Lord to preach a series of messages entitled "World of Possibilities."
- As a result of that series, I was encouraged to publish a book in 2006 based on the sermons preached in that series. The book was entitled "A World of Possibilities."
- One of the sections of the book deals with the enemies of possibilities. Within this section there is a chapter called "No More Fears" which identifies fear as an enemy of our possibilities.

- Fear is defined by Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary as an unpleasant often strong emotion caused by the anticipation of danger.
- History has shown us that fear is one of the most debilitating emotions that we will ever experience. It has been said that fear paralyses the human spirit.
- That is why the Bible warns us so strongly against this deadly enemy of our possibilities called fear.

- The phrase "Fear not" or "Be not afraid" is found some 365 times in The Bible.
 That's one for every day of the year.
- Many people have missed their blessing simply because they were paralyzed by their fear, and was too afraid to go and claim what God had promised to them.
- David was not one of them, as witnessed with his confrontation with the giant Goliath.

- In our Text, David writes: "I will fear no evil."
- Let us now examine how he accomplished this.
- The first thing David did was to recognize or identify the enemy of fear.
- The Apostle writes in 2 Timothy 1:7, what David already knew, that the enemy of fear is a spirit.
- The second thing David did was to confront his fears. David did not run, nor did he hide. He had the courage to face it.

- A word of advice for everyone that is walking around afraid: face your fears, stop hiding or running from things that God has given us the victory over.
- The third and final thing that David did in conquering his fear was to rely on the word of God.
- David writes in **Psalms 119:105**, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."

 How does one overcome fear? Remember to do these Three things: 1). Identify it.

2). Confront it.

3). Rely on God's Word.
